New Business	New Book Lending Box (Mini Library) Sam brought forward to the BOD that some neighbors are interested in adding an additional lending box in a central location. He said a neighbor is willing to make the box and shared a photo of the style, which is basic and straightforward, and a bit different from our existing little lending library box. Places that had been suggested to locate the box were discussed and the trailhead that goes by the graveyard seemed to be the best option for a central location that is on SO common areas, which are the only places we are allowed to put up such a structure for common use (according to all guidelines we must follow). Catherine added that this seems a good choice because there is a bench nearby in the graveyard that people could use if they want to read a bit before deciding on a book. Additional design ideas, such as whimsical designs, were discussed and it was decided to keep the box simple and muted in this natural setting, and not the colorful exterior of our other little lending library, and to make sure the new box is aesthetically pleasing as well as respectful in nature to be placed so that it is still visible from the road but down the trail compared to the trail head sign.
